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# **FOREWORD**

This Report presents a quantitative account of the work undertaken by the Probation and Welfare Service for the years 2000 to 2003. Information is presented in relation to the numbers of reports prepared for courts and supervision of individuals on community sanctions. The report also outlines the main areas of work undertaken in institutions as well as service involvement with community groups providing facilities and programmes for offenders.

The Probation and Welfare Service is committed to the management of offenders in the community by way of planned supervision programmes combined with effective, co-ordinated action with other agencies. For offenders at increasing risk of receiving custodial sentences, the ongoing challenge faced by the Service is to devise and implement, with contributions from other statutory and voluntary bodies, programmes that will both challenge and help to change offending behaviour and improve the social inclusion and functioning of participants. Much of this work is done by community based projects, funded by the Department of Justice, Equality and Law Reform, through the Service. The Service commits time and expertise to advancing and developing such initiatives.

Staff of the Service also work with offenders in penal custody, and young people in detention, to prepare them and their families for return to the community. Post-custody supervision is an integral part of programmes for offenders released from custody and again the community based projects often play a central role in the implementation of these programmes.

The Service looks forward to building on its past achievements and addressing future challenges.

# **PART I**

## **REVIEW OF THE YEARS 2000 TO 2003**

### **1. Introduction**

This report presents a quantitative account of the work undertaken by the Probation and Welfare Service in the years 2000 to 2003, including in particular details of reports prepared for Courts and supervision of offenders on community sanctions. It outlines some of the main areas of work undertaken in custodial institutions, as well as Service involvement in workshops, hostels and other facilities operated under its aegis.

### **2. Background to the Report**

Since the publication of the 1999 Annual Report, demands on the Probation and Welfare Service from the Courts and prisons have been unremitting. Due to a range of pressures on all parts of the organisation, a number of annual reports (specifically in respect of 2000 to 2003) were not published up to now. The present review is a significant step towards rectifying that situation. The data presented in this report was compiled and analysed both electronically and manually. The assistance provided by numerous staff in assisting in this process is acknowledged and appreciated.

The majority of tables presented in this report are similar in format to those presented in previous Annual Reports and are therefore comparable with them in terms of measuring changes in output and demands for probation intervention over time. A new computerised *Case Tracking System* (CTS) has been developed and rolled out across the Probation and Welfare Service. The first full year of CTS implementation across the Service was 2005 and it is anticipated that this will greatly assist in the future provision of relevant and timely information on the Service.

The CTS began to be implemented in the Dublin Region towards the end of 2003 and therefore other data gathering systems were updated or discontinued. Unfortunately, this led to the loss of some data during the change over phase. Assessments and

reports for Courts were prepared and resulting supervision orders implemented and managed as always. However, some details on a number of referrals in the greater Dublin area were omitted from or inadequately entered onto the new system (CTS). A series of statistical exercises were conducted to ascertain the volume of missed entries for Dublin and the following statistical shortfalls were estimated:

It was decided to only include in this review figures in relation to work inputs and outputs that are actually recorded in our data gathering systems, and not to include estimates on items that have been lost in the change to the new CTS. Statistics given in the tables following that include data in respect of the Dublin area are consequently potentially 'short' up to the extent shown above. Since these estimated shortfalls were not added to the Tables presented in this report, the above figures and explanation should be borne in mind in examining data relating to the Dublin Region (only) for 2003.

### **3. Presentation of Probation and Welfare Service Data for the Years 2000 to 2003**

#### ***3.1 Pre-Sanction Reports and Community Service Reports***

##### ***3.1.1 Volume and Type***

The purpose of *Pre-Sanction Reports* and *Community Service Reports* is to assist the Courts in determining the appropriate penalty for criminal offences, by assessing the risks posed by offenders and their suitability for community based sanctions, such as *Probation Orders* and *Community Service Orders*.

In 2003, the total number of requests for assessments and reports from the Courts was 6,642. The total number of requests for reports in 2003 and the preceding four years is presented in Table 1 below. These data refer to the initial referral or first reports

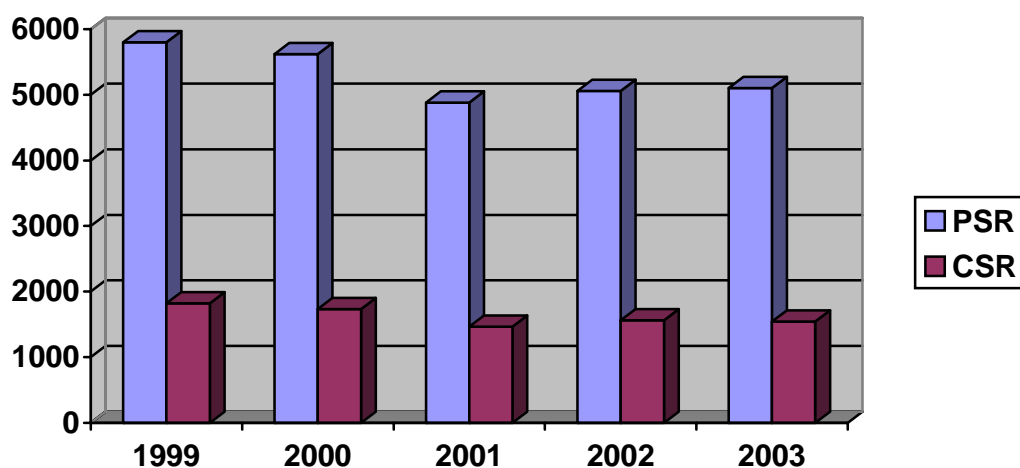
only and do not include update and progress reports. In 2000, a workload agreement was reached between Probation and Welfare Service management and the IMPACT Union. This agreement placed maximum limits on the volume of work of individual Probation and Welfare Officers working on Courts/community based teams. There was an apparent and almost immediate reduction in the numbers of assessments and reports undertaken for Courts. In 2001 the volume of *Pre-Sanction Reports* fell to 4,881 and *Community Service Reports* to 1,467.

The ratio of requests for *Pre-Sanction Reports* (PSRs) compared to *Community Service Reports* (CSRs) has remained relatively stable over the period 2000 to 2003. This is outlined in Figure 1 below. The data show that consistently in each year approximately 76% of the total number of reports were PSRs and 23% were CSRs.

**Figure 1: Reports to Courts, 1999-2003**



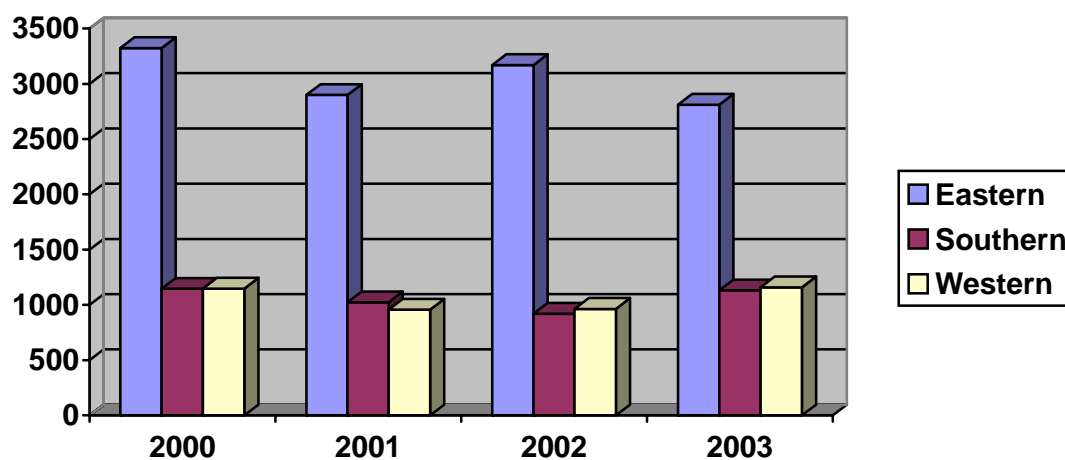
### 3.1.2 Pre-Sanction Reports

The nationwide spread of court requests for *Pre-Sanction Reports* (PSRs) across the Service has remained relatively stable. The data show that about half of the PSRs were prepared in Dublin. An analysis of the regional spread of *Pre-Sanction Reports* is set out in Table 2 and Figure 2 below<sup>1</sup>.

### 3.1.3 Community Service Reports

A regional analysis of *Community Service Reports* (CSRs) is illustrated below in Table 3 and Figure 3. As with other reports a decrease in the volume of reports

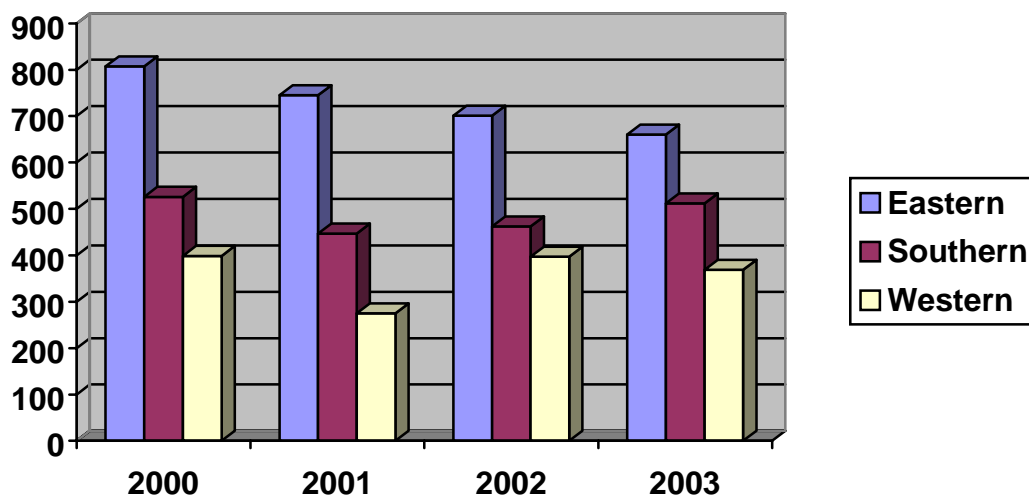

produced is noticeable, particularly following the year 2000, with a relatively stable pattern evident in the years 2001, 2002 and 2003.

#### **3.1.4 Decisions following presentation of pre-sanction reports**

Data collected by the Probation and Welfare Service record judicial decisions or disposals, made subsequent to the submission by the Probation and Welfare Service of *Pre-Sanction Reports* to Courts. The disposals requiring the continued involvement of the Service include *Probation Bonds/Orders*, *Recognisances under the Misuse of Drugs Act (MDA), 1977-1984*, and *Supervision during Deferment of Penalty*. An analysis of these data for *Pre-Sanction Reports* submitted to the District Court indicates that District Courts sought continued intervention by the Service in about two in every three of these cases, i.e. 63% of the total in 2000, 66% in 2001, 65% in 2002, and 72% in 2003.



A slight decline is indicated in corresponding figures for the Circuit Court, i.e. 79% of the total number of PSRs led to continued involvement by the Service in 2000 and 2001, dropping to 74% in 2002 but rising again to 76% in 2003. Table 4 below highlights the data for both Courts combined, while Table 5 shows a comparison between the District and Circuit Courts.

### ***3.1.5 Decisions following presentation of Community Service Reports***

Similarly, the District Court and Circuit Court disposals on foot of *Community Service Reports* (CSRs) may be analysed for the continued involvement of the Service in these particular cases. The data reveals that *Community Service Orders* were imposed by the District Court in around half of the cases where a CSR was presented. In 2000, 55% of CSRs resulted in the imposition of a *Community Service Order*. For the years 2001, 2002 and 2003, the percentage was 50%, 58% and 49% respectively. However, even where a *Community Service Order* was not imposed, the Court ordered ongoing probation supervision in a number of cases rather than proceeding to impose a custodial sentence. In total, where a CSR was requested, intervention by the Service continued and increased from 80% in 2000, to 81% in 2001, 84% in 2002 and then finally 87% of cases during 2003.

At Circuit Court level, where a *Community Service Report* was presented, the Court imposed *Community Service Orders* in a significant number of cases. In 2000, the

percentage was 60%. This had declined to 58% by 2003. As with the District Court, there is a pattern of continuing to involve the Service by way of court directed supervision in the majority of those cases where a *Community Service Report* is submitted to Court. In 2000, the Service involvement continued in 95% of cases where a CSR was presented; in 2001 it was 85%; in 2002 - 89%, and in 2003 - 93%. Data on the decisions made by the District and Circuit Courts, in relation to *Community Service Reports* can be seen in Table 6. Table 7 sets out the statistical comparison of decisions made in both Courts.

***3.1.6 No Appearance by defendant, Warrant Issued***

The volume of warrants to arrest that were issued, following non-appearance in Court, was uniformly small in the cases above for both the District and Circuit Courts over the period 2000 to 2003. Analysis of Probation and Welfare Service data on *Pre-Sanction Reports* submitted to the District Court reveals that in this period, warrants were issued following non-appearance at Court in 8% of cases, while at Circuit Court level, these were issued in around 1% of such cases.

Data collected about *Community Service Reports* reveal that warrants to arrest following non-appearance in Court were issued by District Courts in 5% of referrals between 2000 and 2003. At Circuit Court level, Service records indicate that no warrants were issued following presentation of *Community Service Reports* in the years 2000 to 2003, and a small number (2% of the total) in 2003. The above statistics indicate that the vast majority of offenders on whom reports are prepared

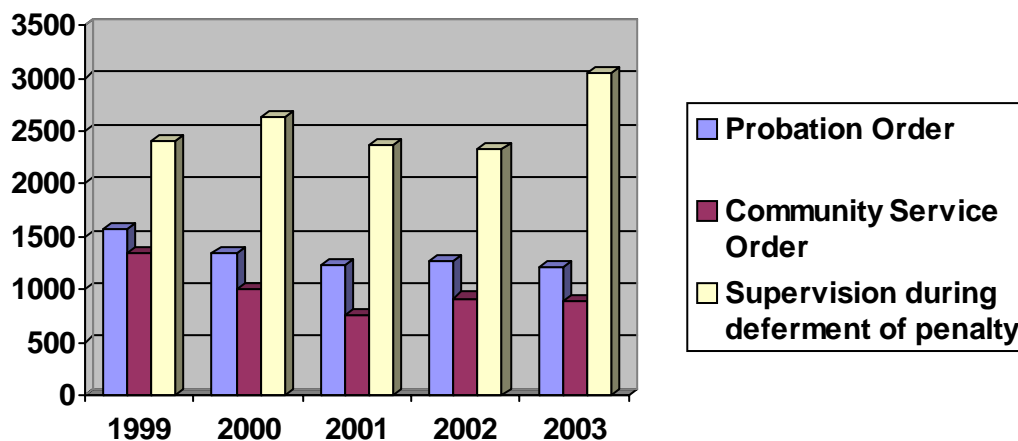
subsequently attend Court, at which point the assessment and report may be considered by the Court.

### 3.2 Supervision by the Service

#### 3.2.1 Volume and Type

There were significant numbers of offenders supervised by the Probation and Welfare Service during the years 1999-2003 (see Table 8 and Figure 4 below). The types of community based sanctions imposed by the courts and supervised by the Probation and Welfare Service can be divided into three categories, that is, *Probation Orders*, *Community Service Orders* and *Supervision during Deferment of Penalty* (Figure 4).

The data show that there has been a slight reduction in the volume of *Probation Orders* and *Community Service Orders*, with a corresponding increase in the levels of *Supervision during Deferment of Penalty* by the Courts. In 2000, the proportion of *Probation Orders* relative to other court ordered supervision was 27%. By 2003, it was 24%.

Likewise, *Community Service Orders* comprised 20% of court ordered supervision in 2000, and this figure was 17 % in 2003. However, the number of offenders subject to *Supervision during Deferment of Penalty* as a proportion of those on Court Ordered Supervision increased from 53% in 2000, to 59% in 2003. Therefore, in over half of

the referrals made to the Service by the Courts, the statutory format for supervision provided by the 1907 and 1983 legislation was not availed of in these cases (see Table 8 below).

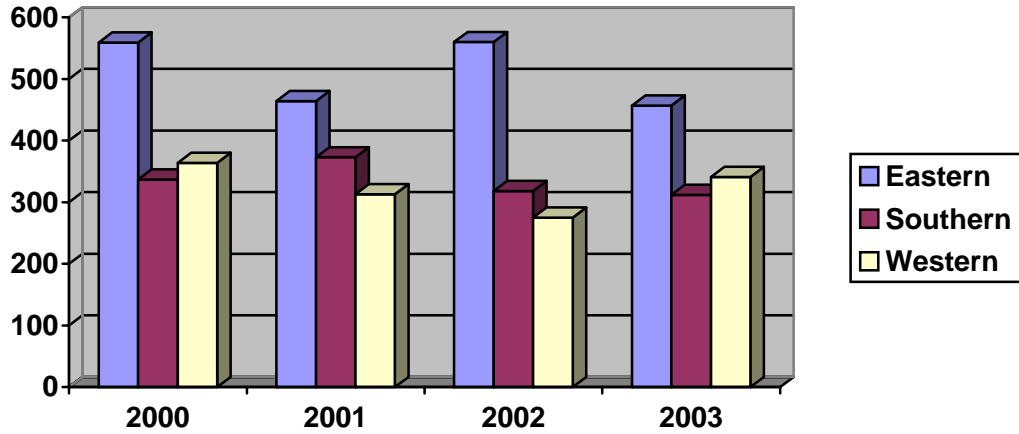
### 3.2.2 Probation Orders

An analysis of *Probation Orders* imposed by the District and Circuit Courts during the years 2000-2003 is illustrated in the table below. A further level of analysis, looking at the regional spread of the *Probation Orders* imposed by the District and Circuit Court is graphically illustrated in Table 9 and Figures 5 and 6 below.

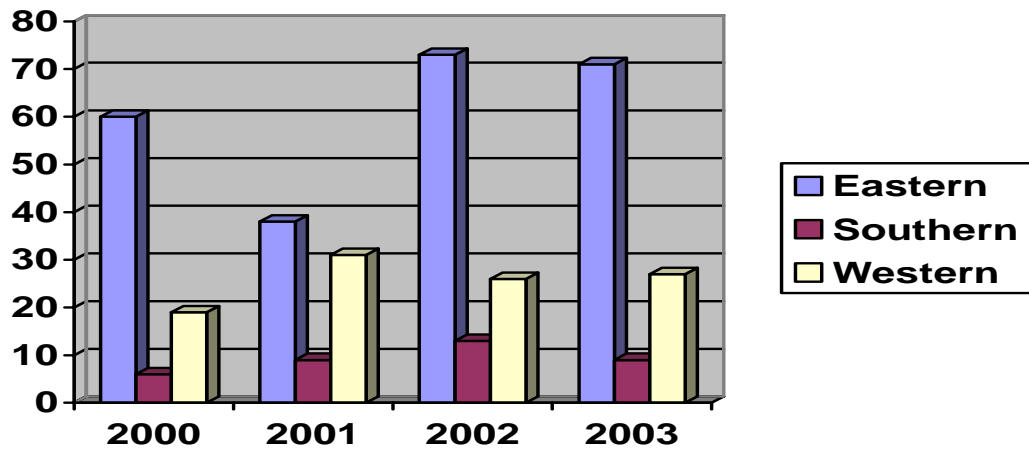

**Figure 6: Probation Orders imposed by the Circuit Court, 2000-2003**



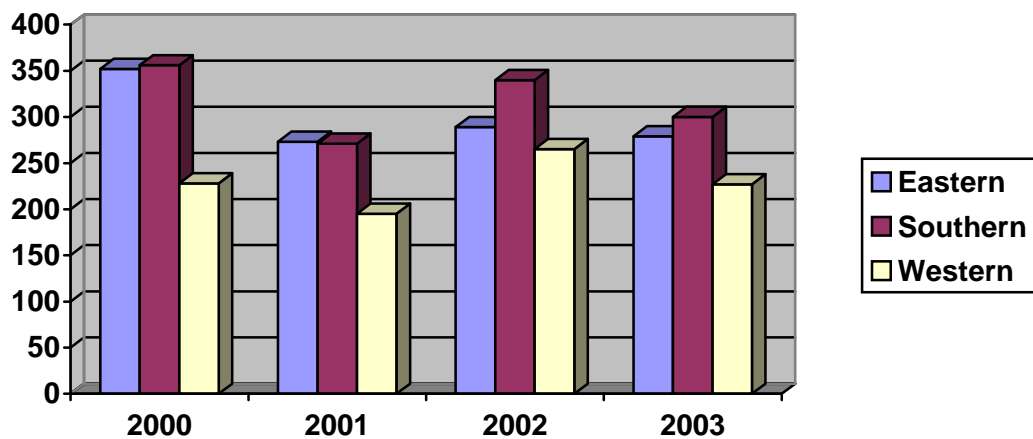
### **3.2.3 Community Service Orders**

A similar analysis of *Community Service Orders* by the Court imposing the Order and the regional spread is illustrated by Table 10 and Figures 7 and 8 below.

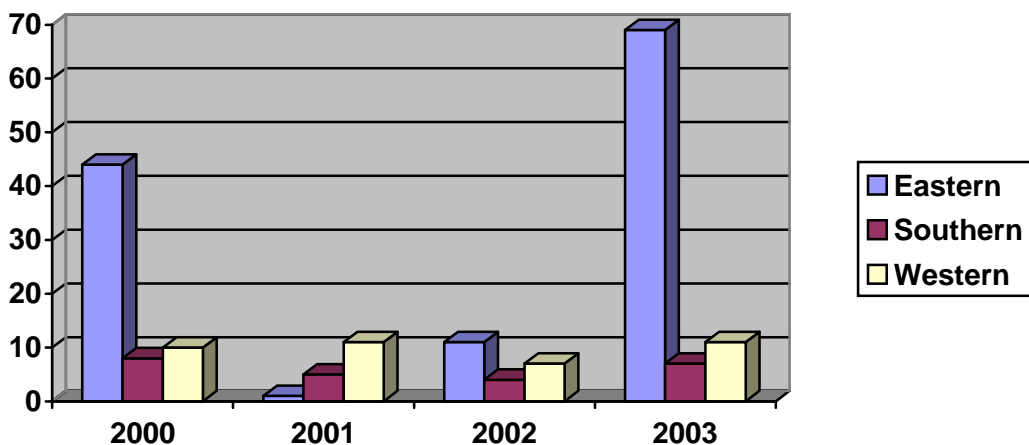

### 3.2.4 Duration of Supervision

The nature, intensity and average duration of different types of supervision varies. This is illustrated in Table 11 below. The typical duration of a *Probation Order* was from 12 to 18 months. This category has increased in the period 2000 to 2003, from 60% to 65%. The data also show a decline in the 24 months and over duration category - from 19% in 2000 to 13% in 2003.

Between 2000 and 2003, *Community Service Orders* in respect of 81 to 120 hours work imposed on individual offenders comprised the largest single band of Orders made. This trend has remained stable over the period, 2000-2003, with 29% of all CSOs imposed in 2000 and 28% in 2003. The other categories have on balance remained steady over the years 2000 to 2003. This is illustrated in Table 12 below.

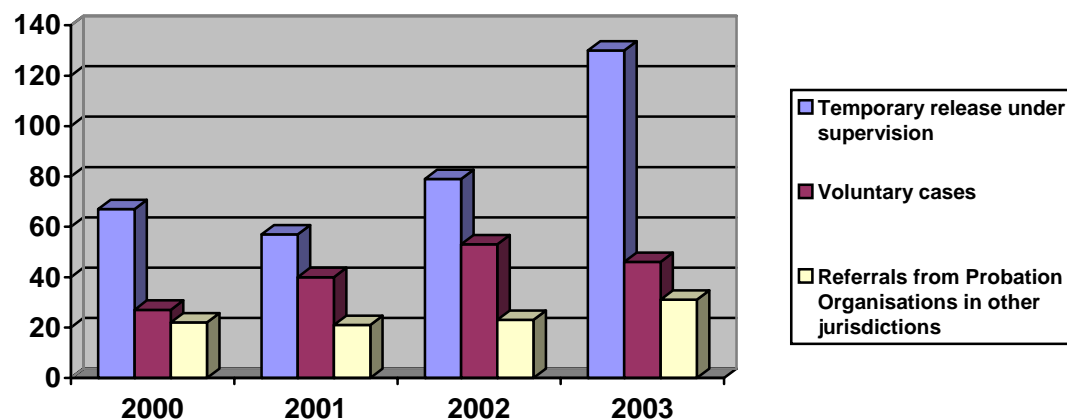
### 3.3 Referrals for Supervision from Other Sources

The Probation and Welfare Service receives referrals from sources other than the Courts. While the volume is small, there has been an increase in referrals from other sources from 116 in 2000 to 207 referrals in 2003. Such referrals include offenders granted *Temporary Release (TR)* from prisons and places of detention, offenders returning to the community where supervision is requested by probation organisations in other jurisdictions and a small number of offenders who continue to seek support and guidance from the Service on a voluntary basis, after their court ordered supervision expires (see Table 13 and Figure 9 below).

Those prisoners subject to probation supervision while on *Temporary Release* (TR) represent the largest proportion of non-court referrals. During the period 2000 to 2002, about a third of those on supervised TR by the Probation and Welfare Service were in the 40 years or older age category. However in 2003, the 30 to 40 year old category comprised 32% of all those supervised by the Service, while the 40 years and over age group constituted 27% of this group.

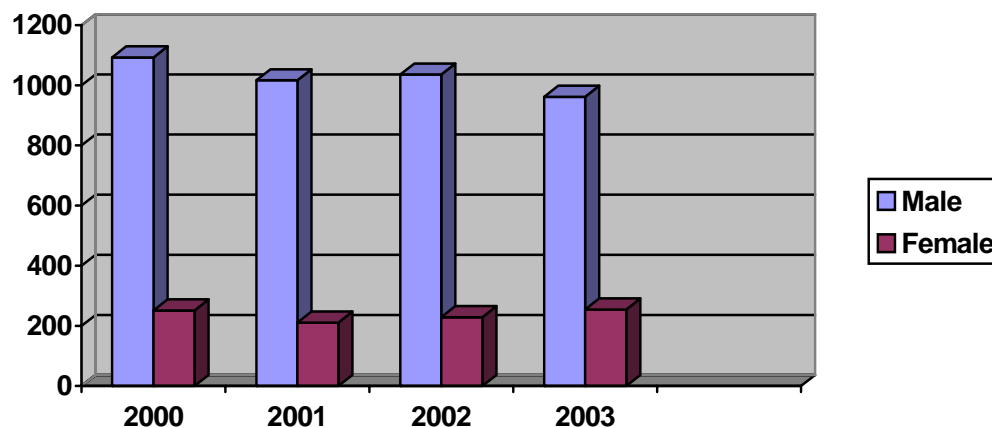
### 3.4 Gender Analysis

Male offenders continue to comprise the largest proportion of cases supervised by the Probation and Welfare Service. The proportion of females of the total population of offenders subject to *Probation Orders* has remained relatively stable. In 2000, females accounted for 19% of all on *Probation Orders*, while in 2003 the comparative figure was 21%. The numbers of male and female offenders subject to *Probation Orders* are illustrated in Table 14 and Figure 10 below.

**Figure 10: Gender of those placed on Probation Orders, 2000-2003**

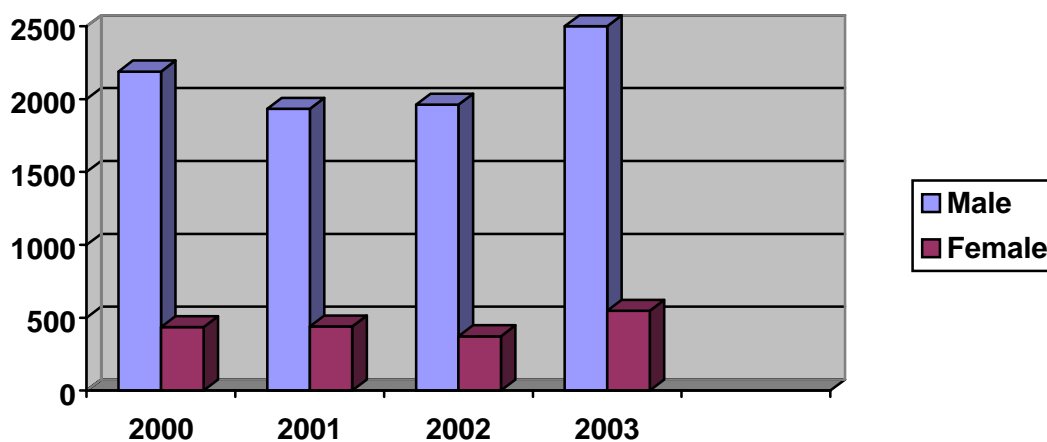

**Figure 11: Gender of those placed on Supervision during Deferment of Penalty, 2000-2003**

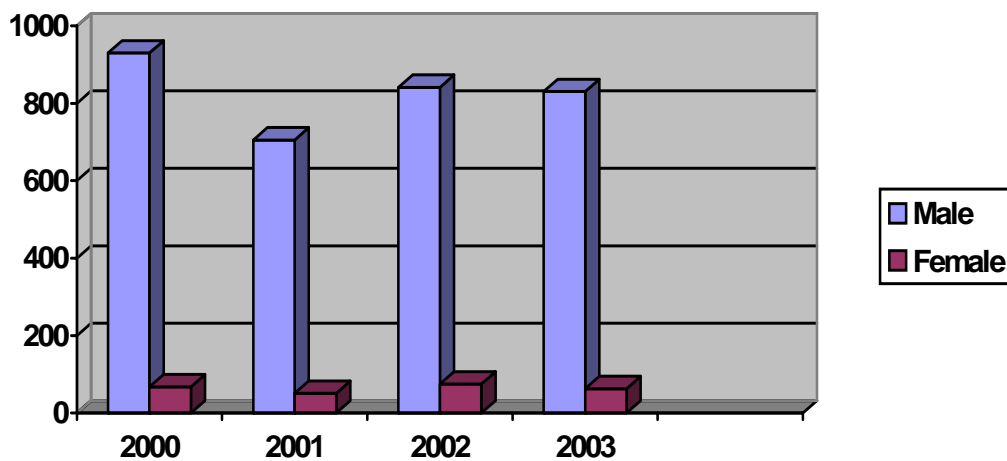


The data show that there are smaller numbers of female than male offenders on *Community Service Orders*. The proportion of females in relation to all offenders on *Community Service Orders* has remained stable between 2000 and 2003, at around 7%. Table 16 and Figure 12 below show the comparison of male to female offenders subject to *Community Service Orders* between 2000 and 2003.

The proportion of females subject to *Community Service Orders* (7%) is significantly less than those placed on *Probation Orders* or *Supervision during Deferment of Penalty* (18%). With regard to *Pre-Sanction Reports*, females account for 17% of the total and 8% of offenders on whom a *Community Service Report* is prepared. Table 17 shows data for the number of females on which *Pre-Sanction Reports* and *Community Service Reports* were prepared and the percentage of females placed on Court Ordered Supervision.

### ***3.5 Age Analysis***

Age can be a significant factor in an offender's ability and willingness to change. This section analyses the known age patterns of offenders referred to the Probation and Welfare Service, either for the preparation of reports or for supervision on a community based sanction. However, in some cases information on the age was not available to the Service.

#### ***3.5.1 Pre-Sanction Reports***

Analysis of *Pre-Sanction Reports* according to age reveals consistent patterns. Of all offenders for whom *Pre-Sanction Reports* are requested, juveniles (i.e. those who have not yet reached their eighteenth birthday) comprise 16% of the total for each of the years 2000 to 2003, except for 2001, when they accounted for 18% of the total. Similarly, for all other age categories, the trends remain stable, with a slight increase in the 40 years and over category, from 6% in 2000 to 8% in 2003. This is illustrated in Table 18 below.

### 3.5.2 Community Service Reports

Similarly, there are relatively stable patterns in relation to the age profile of offenders referred for *Community Service Reports*. However, there has been a fall in the number of *Community Service Reports* prepared in the juvenile category, that is on those aged 16 and 17 years<sup>6</sup>, from 9% in 2000 to 5% in 2003, as outlined in Table 19 below.

### 3.5.3 Probation Orders

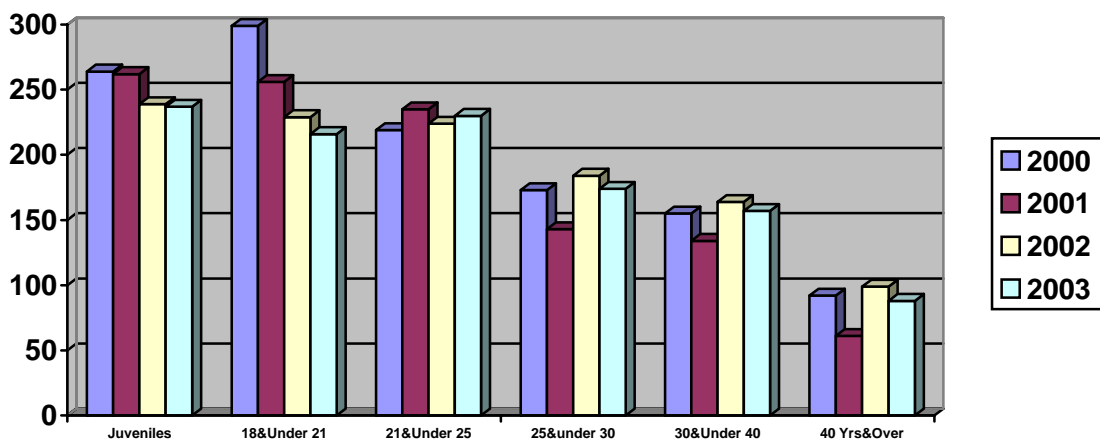
Overall, the proportion of offenders categorised by age has remained relatively stable in relation to *Probation Orders* for the years 2000 to 2003. However, there has been a slight decline in the 18 to 21 year old age group, from 22% in 2000 to 18% in 2003. A small increase was also noticeable in the 21 to 25 year old age group - from 16% in 2000 to 19% in 2003. The proportional share by age groups is outlined in Table 20, while Figure 13 below shows the number of individuals in each age group.

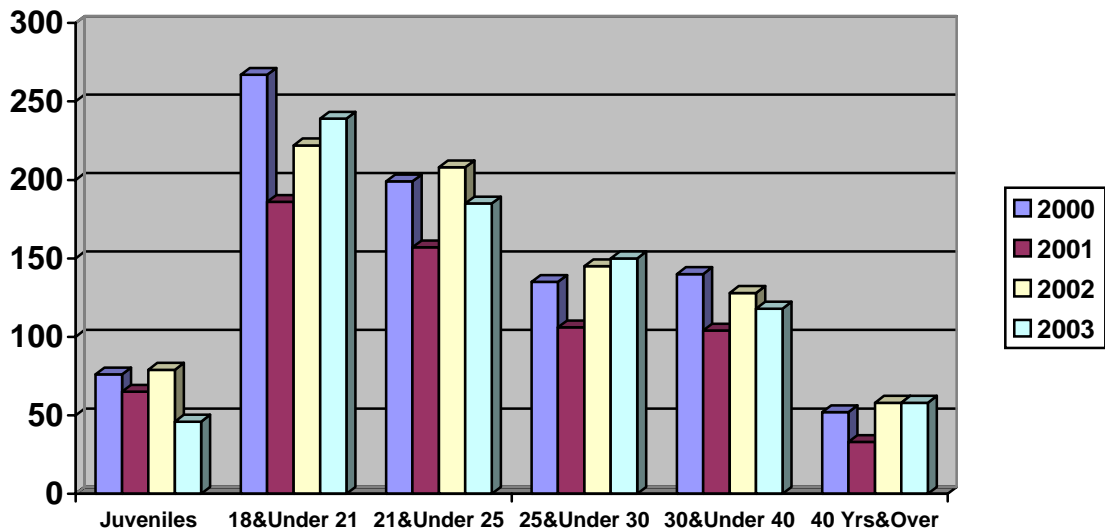

**Figure 14: Age Classification of those placed on Community Service Orders, 2000-2003**



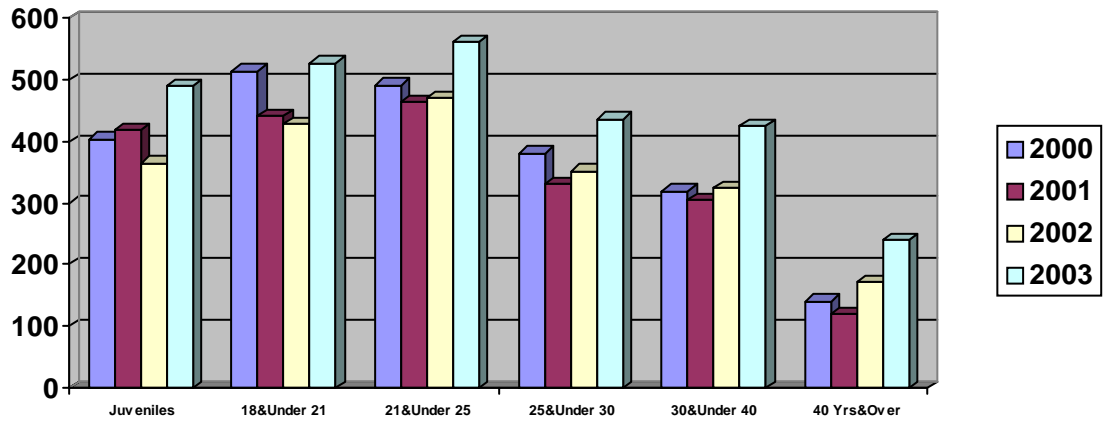
### 3.5.5 Supervision during Deferment of Penalty

Comparative trends have also remained relatively stable for the age profile of those placed on *Supervision during Deferment of Penalty* in the period 2000 to 2003. However, there has been a slight fall in the 18 to 21 years old category - from 20% of the total in 2000 to 17% in 2003. There was a slight increase in the 30-40 years age group - from 12% in 2000 to 14% in 2003, and similarly in the 40 years and over age group there was an increase from 5% in 2000 to 8% in 2003.
