### **Message from Director**

This month, I am delighted to publish the Probation Service's new strategic plan, for 2015-2017. The document - *Lasting Change through Offender Rehabilitation* - sets out an ambitious work programme for the next three years. Our focus in this plan is very much on how we can focus on and facilitate positive change, rehabilitation and social reintegration in the offenders we work with, in the community and in custody, to help achieve safer communities and fewer victims. As always, there is considerable focus in the strategic plan on interagency and inter-jurisdictional work and programme development. The core work of the Probation Service, set out in the strategy, is focused on managing Court orders effectively, reducing offenders' risk of harm and of reoffending,

and making good the harm caused by crime. These high level goals will be progressed through a series of thirty-four specific actions, under five thematic work areas.

Accurate, up to date data are also crucial in contributing to effective policy-making and organisational resource and work planning. I am also pleased to announce the publication of a new set of headline statistics related to the Probation Service's work. The monthly offender population will be published on the first working day of each month and will be available on our website. The first publication of these statistics - in respect of March 2015 - is now available on our website. Production and publication of these and other Service data will further help us to improve how we monitor and manage our work demands, outputs and outcomes, and manage resources accordingly.

The next edition of *Probation works* will be published in May 2015.

### Probation Service to publish regular Statistical updates online

Starting this month (March 2015) the Probation Service will publish monthly statistical updates on the Service's caseload of offenders currently being dealt with in the community and in custody. This summary information, taken from data on our (IT) Case Tracking System, will reflect a 'snapshot' of our caseload at a single point in time each month, and will be published on the first working day of each month.

While the categorisation of probation referrals can be relatively complex in reality, this monthly bulletin will capture and reflect the situation in simple terms, highlighting 'headline' categorisations by geographical spread, age and gender, predominantly, with some statistical breakdown of some of the more significant supervision categories. This initiative marks an important development and the resulting statistics will be available to Service stakeholders, researchers and anyone with an interest in the work of the Service. ### **North South Co-operation**

A meeting of the Public Protection Advisory Group, which is co-chaired by Probation Service Director Vivian Geiran and (Acting) Director of the Probation Board for Northern Ireland, Cheryl Lamont, was held in Probation Service Headquarters building in Haymarket, Dublin on Friday 20th of March.

The Group meets alternately in Dublin and Belfast and co-ordinates the joint - police/prisons/probation - public protection work programme across the island. One of the annual features of this cooperation is the now annual North-South PPAG seminar, which brings together probation, prisons and police practitioners from all six services, to share good practice, consider ongoing and future developments, and input to criminal justice policy and practice development.

A primary focus of Athlone Tidy Towns is to encourage the local community to improve their environment and make the area a better place to live, work and visit. It is the epitome of community spirit whereby local people come together to improve their own area. People subject to both community service and community return have played a pivotal role in assisting Athlone Tidy Towns in meeting their objectives.

Christy Haugh, Community Service Supervisor oversees the work of both community service and community return participants in the area. Work undertaken includes a variety of tasks such as the installation and maintenance of flowerbeds, potting up hanging baskets, trimming grass, pruning shrubs, weeding, litter picking and the painting of railings and bins throughout the park and town.

The work has proven to be very rewarding to the community service participants and also provides them with a number of new skills and allows the participant to give something back to their local community as a means for making up for their offending behaviour.
